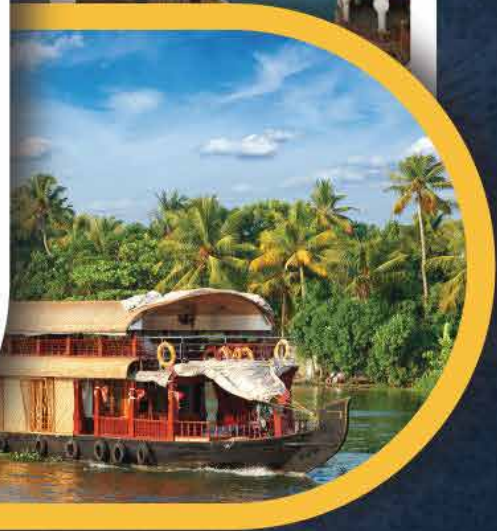
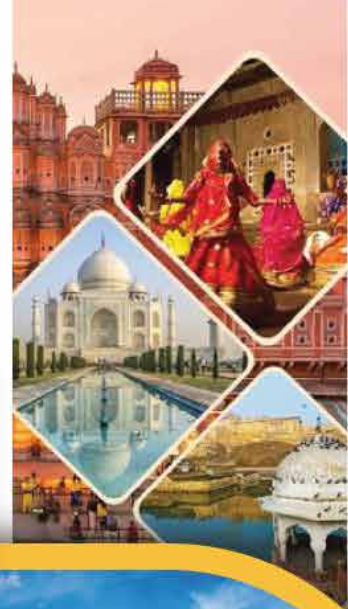
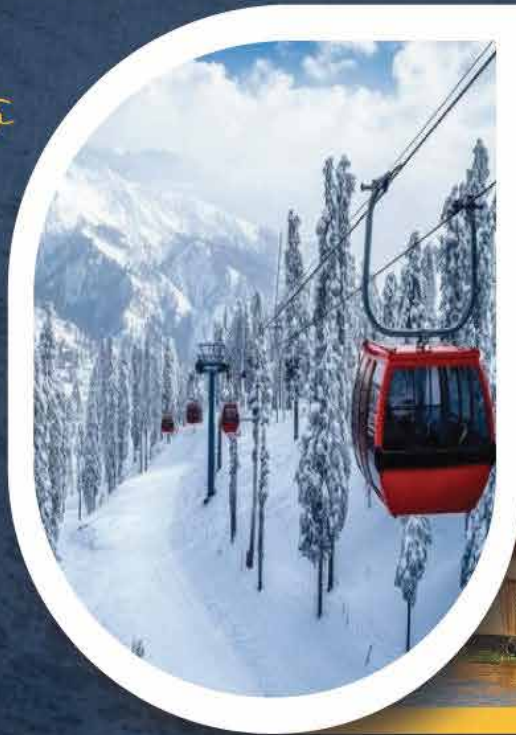

## Day 01: Delhi

**Majestic Humayun's Tomb**, a stunning Mughal masterpiece built in 1565 by Empress Bega Begum in memory of Emperor Humayun, and admired as a precursor to the Taj Mahal.

### **Sightseeing of Old Delhi.**

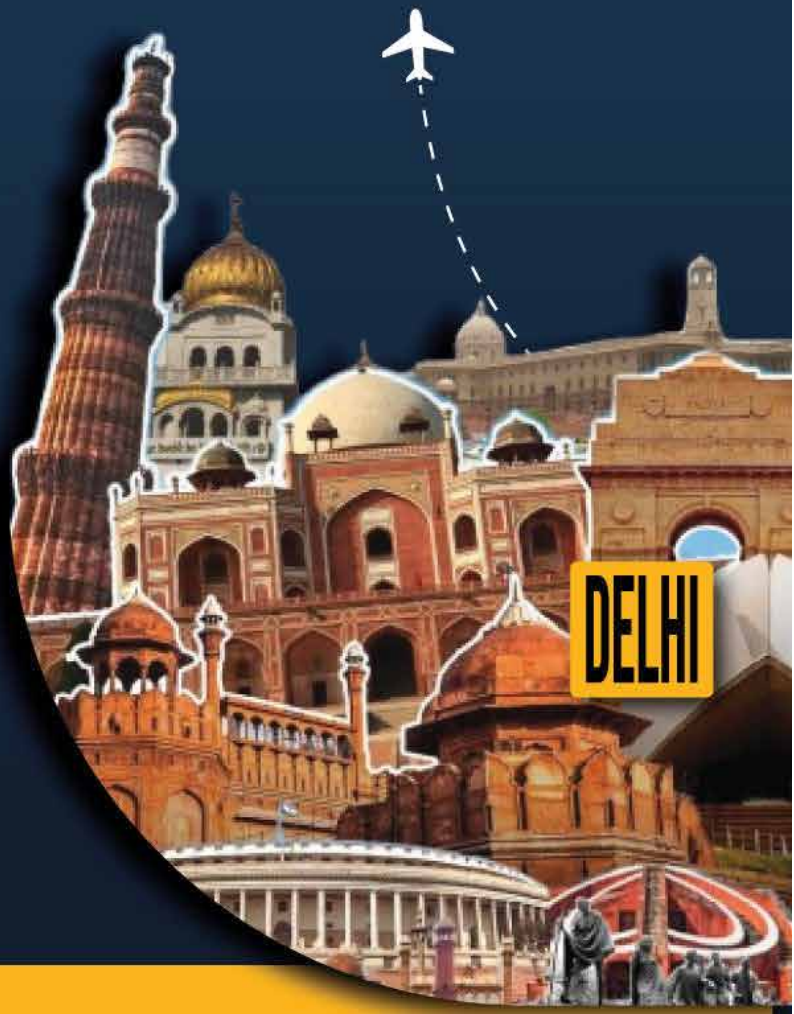

**Red Fort** Drive past the iconic Red Fort, the magnificent red sandstone fort built

by Emperor Shah Jahan in 1648, symbolizing the grandeur of Mughal Delhi.

**Raj Ghat**, Visit Raj Ghat, the memorial where Mahatma Gandhi was cremated, and drive past the historic ruins of Feroz Shah Kotla, home to an **ancient Ashokan pillar**.

## *Same Day Agra Excursion*

Day 01: Delhi / Agra / Delhi (210km / 04hrs) Each way

**A timeless symbol of love, the Taj Mahal shines like a dream in white marble**

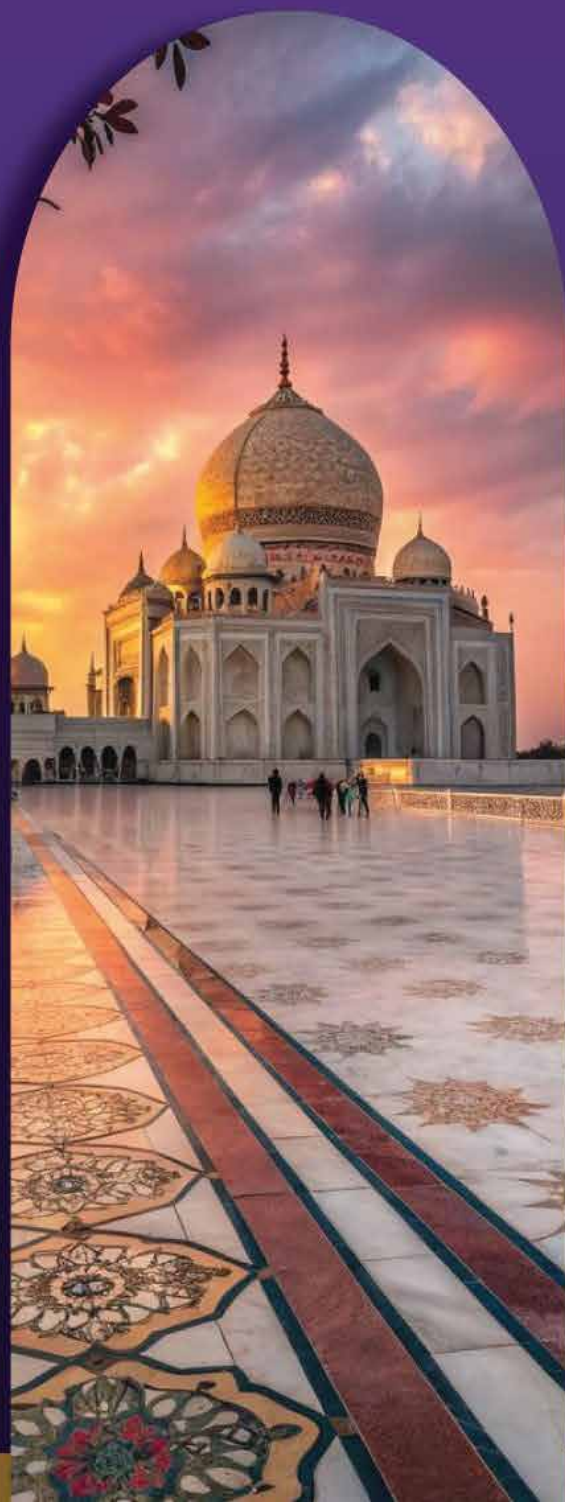
Morning after breakfast at hotel, our car will pick you up & then proceed to Agra for full day sightseeing tour.

Agra, the grand capital of the **Mughal Empire** in the 16th and 17th centuries, is famed for its magnificent forts, palaces, and gardens along the Yamuna River, including the world-renowned Taj Mahal, Agra Fort, and Fatehpur Sikri.

Taj Mahal, Visit the breathtaking Taj Mahal, the world's most celebrated symbol of love, built by Emperor Shah Jahan in memory of Mumtaz Mahal. Admire its timeless beauty before enjoying lunch at a local restaurant.

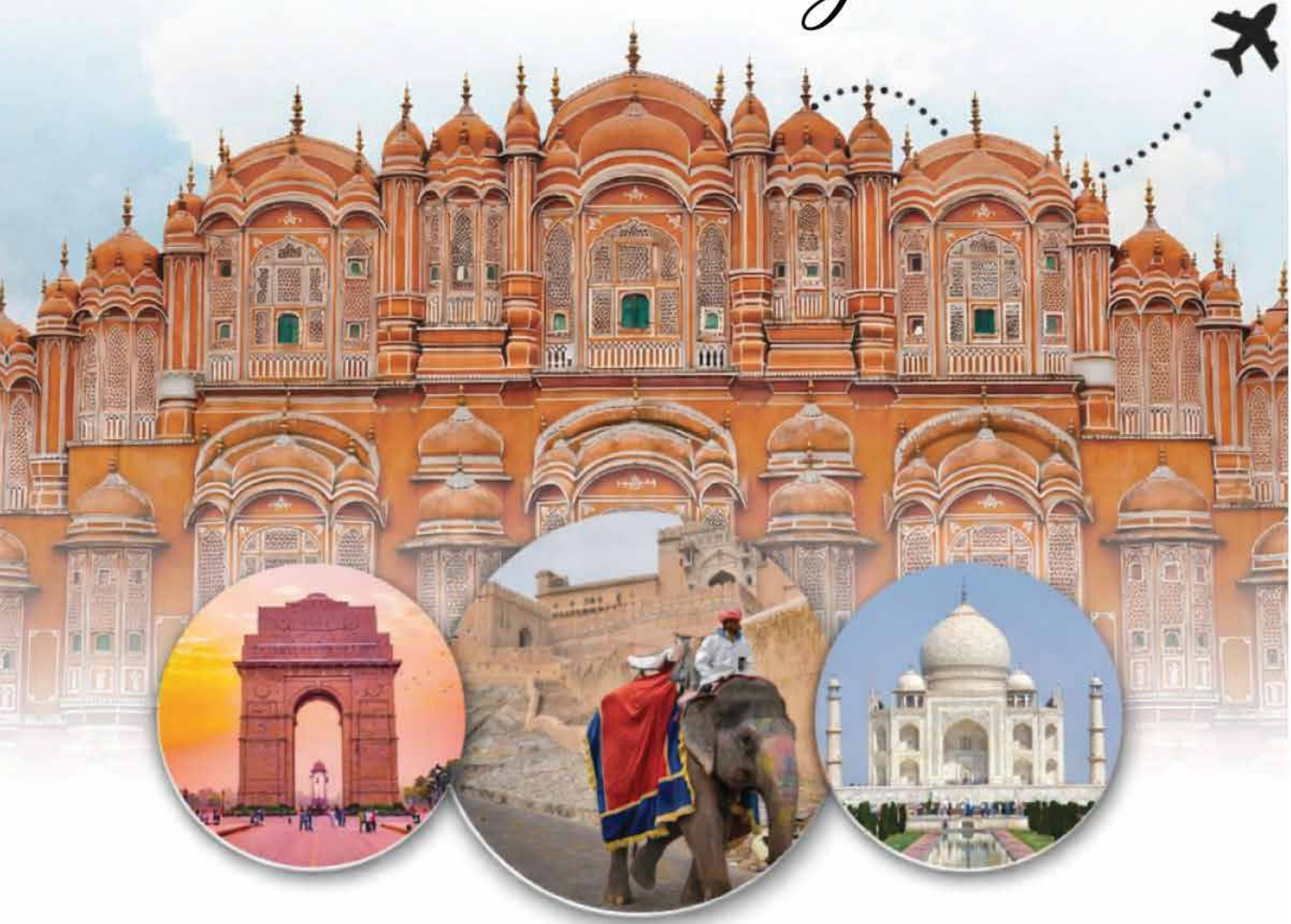

## Golden Triangle



### Day 01: Delhi - Agra (210km/4hrs) by Surface

Morning pick up from the hotel & transfer to Agra.

Agra Once the glorious capital of the Mughal Empire, Agra is celebrated for its magnificent riverside monuments along the Yamuna, including the **UNESCO World Heritage Sites Taj Mahal, Agra Fort, and Fatehpur Sikri.**

On Arrival Check-in at Hotel.

Later visit Taj Mahal, Visit the iconic Taj Mahal, the world's finest symbol of love, built by Emperor Shah Jahan in memory of Mumtaz Mahal, admired for its perfect beauty and changing hues through the day. (Closed on Fridays.)

Agra Fort, Explore the majestic Agra Fort, the grand red sandstone fort begun by Akbar in 1565, featuring ornate halls, royal courtyards, and beautiful views of the Taj Mahal in the distance.

Overnight in Hotel.

## Day 02: Agra - Jaipur (by surface) 241 kms / 4 ½ hrs

**Morning after breakfast drive to Jaipur.**

On arrival check-in at the hotel.

**Jaipur;** Jaipur, the famous **Pink City** founded by **Raja Jai Singh** in the 18th century, enchants visitors with fairy-tale palaces, vibrant culture, and **majestic hilltop forts** set against the **rugged Aravalli ranges**.

Rest of the day free at leisure.

**Overnight in Jaipur.**

## Day 03: In Jaipur

Morning after breakfast, proceed for the city tour of Jaipur (excursion to Amber Fort)

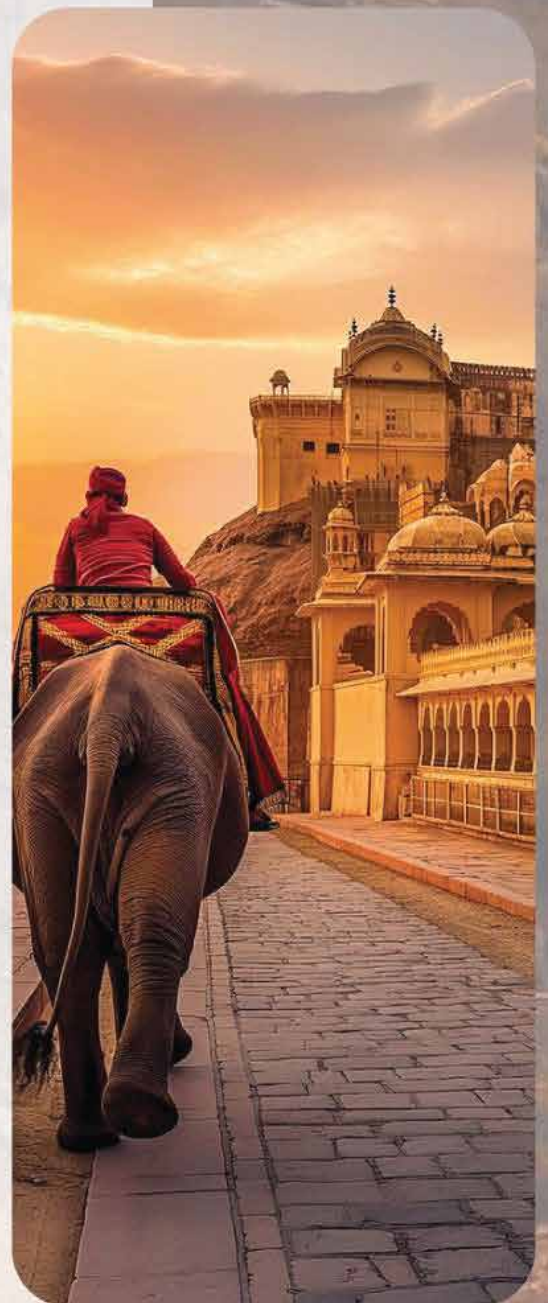
Visit the magnificent **Amer Fort**, a stunning example of Rajput architecture, reflected beautifully in **Mata Lake** below. Explore its royal halls adorned with intricate ivory work, exquisite wall paintings, and delicate mirror inlay. In the afternoon, visit the famous **Jantar Mantar**, the **City Palace & Museum**, and enjoy a photo stop at the iconic **Hawa Mahal** (Palace of Winds).

**City Palace-** A delightful blend of Mughal and traditional Rajasthani architecture, the City Palace covers nearly one-seventh of Jaipur's walled city. It is home to the Chandra Mahal, Shri Govind Dev Temple, and the City Palace Museum.

**Jantar Mantar-** This is the largest and the best preserved of the five observatories built by Jai Singh II in different parts of the country. This observatory consisting of outsized astronomical instruments is still in use.

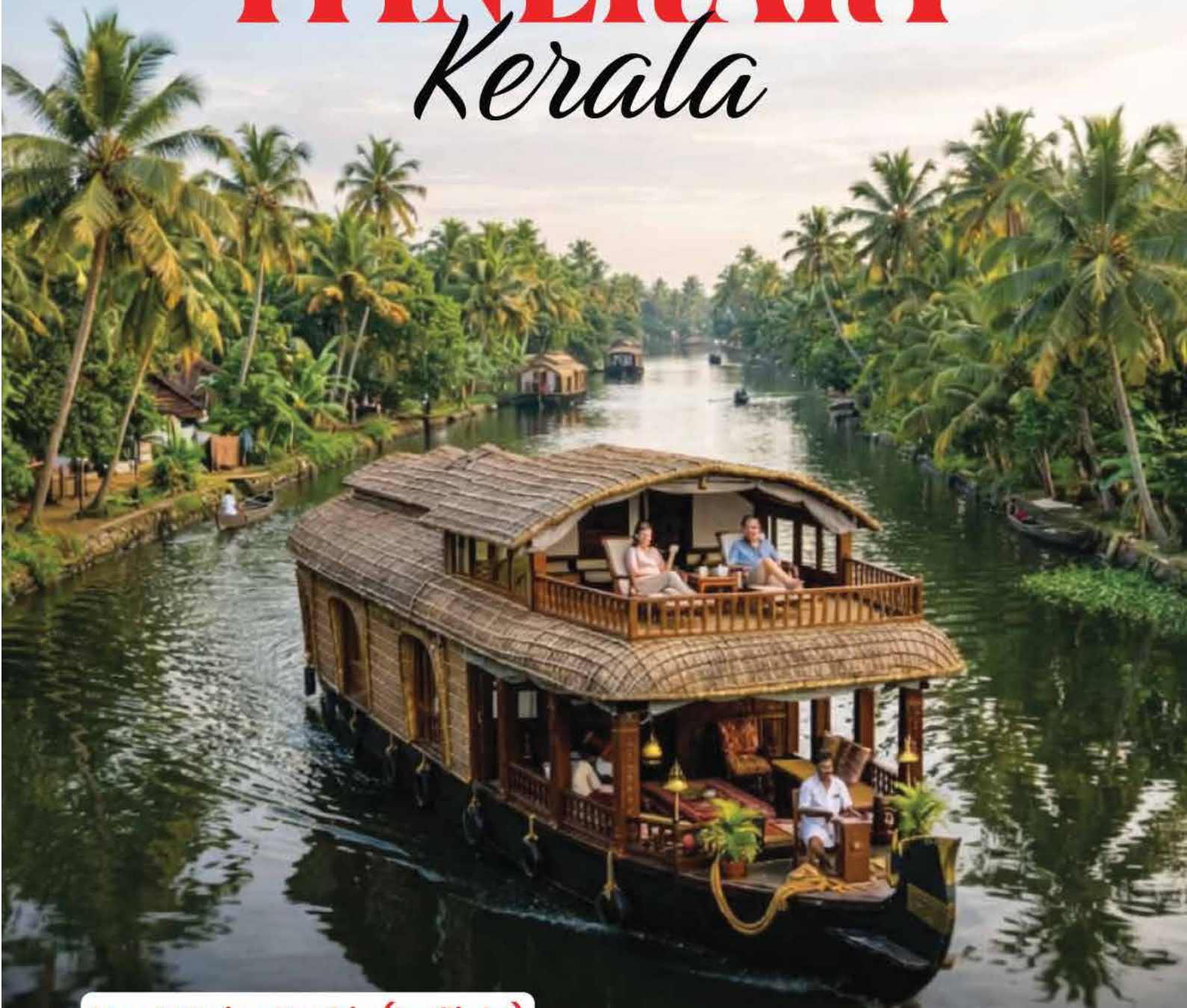
**Hawa Mahal -** The iconic Hawa Mahal (Palace of Winds) is one of Jaipur's most prominent landmarks. This elegant five-storey pink sandstone façade, adorned with delicate latticework and ornate balconies, features 953 windows and niches. Built in 1799 by Maharaja Sawai Pratap Singh, it served as a royal viewing gallery for palace women.

## *Kerala*



### **Day 1: Arrive Cochin (by flight)**

On arrival you will be met & assisted by our representative till check-in at the hotel.

Cochin, Kochi (Cochin) is a charming coastal city known for its rich colonial heritage, scenic backwaters, Fort Kochi, and the iconic Chinese fishing nets. A perfect blend of history, culture, and natural beauty, it serves as the gateway to Kerala's enchanting landscapes.

Evening witnesses the Kath Kali dance show in an Auditorium.

Witness the mesmerizing Kathakali performance, Kerala's iconic dance-drama tradition inspired by ancient epics. With elaborate makeup, vibrant costumes, and expressive storytelling, the artists bring timeless tales to life in a truly captivating way.

Overnight in Cochin.

## Day 2: Cochin – Thekkady

(Periyar) (by surface) 150 kms / 3 ½ hrs.

Morning after breakfast proceed for the sightseeing of Cochin.

**Mattancherry Dutch Palace:** Open from 10:00 to 15:00 hrs (Closed on Fridays and public holidays). Built by the Portuguese in 1555 and later renovated by the Dutch in 1663, this palace houses vibrant 17th-century murals that vividly depict the epic Ramayana.

**Jewish Synagogue:** Open from 10:00 to 12:00 hrs and 15:00 to 17:00 hrs (Closed on all Saturdays and Jewish holidays). Located in Jew Town and Fort Cochin Area, it holds the legend of Jewish trade with Kerala dating back to the times of King Solomon. Wander through the streets lined with charming 17th-century Dutch and traditional Kerala-style houses.

**St. Francis Church:** Open from 09:00 to 13:00 hrs and 14:30 to 17:30 hrs (Closed for visitors on Sundays from 08:00 to 11:00 hrs). This is the oldest European Church in India, housing a treasure trove of antiquities, including a palm-leaf title deed given to the Portuguese by the local Raja in 1503.

**Chinese Fishing Nets:** These unique nets, located along the tip of Fort Cochin, are living symbols of centuries-old Chinese influence on the Kerala coast. Do not miss the chance to witness this iconic fishing method in action.

Immerse yourself in Cochin's rich heritage and diverse cultural influences as you explore these historical landmarks.

Later drive to Thekkady (Periyar). On arrival check-in at the hotel.

(Periyar), Thekkady is a nature lover's paradise, famous for the Periyar Wildlife Sanctuary and scenic Periyar Lake. Enjoy guided treks, boat rides, wildlife sightings, and visits to fragrant spice plantations, making it one of Kerala's most enchanting destinations.

With its lush landscapes, serene lake, and abundant wildlife, Periyar is a nature retreat that promises a unique and unforgettable experience for every traveller.

Overnight in Thekkady (Periyar)

## Day 03: In Thekkady (Periyar)

Morning breakfast in the hotel. Later in time proceed for the boat ride through the Jungle.

Enjoy a 1.5-hour boat ride on Periyar Lake inside the Periyar Tiger Reserve, offering excellent opportunities to spot elephants, sambar deer, gaur, wild boar, otters, and vibrant birdlife along the tranquil shores. A memorable wildlife experience awaits amidst Kerala's pristine natural beauty.

Afternoon visit Spice plantation.

Overnight in Thekkady (Periyar)



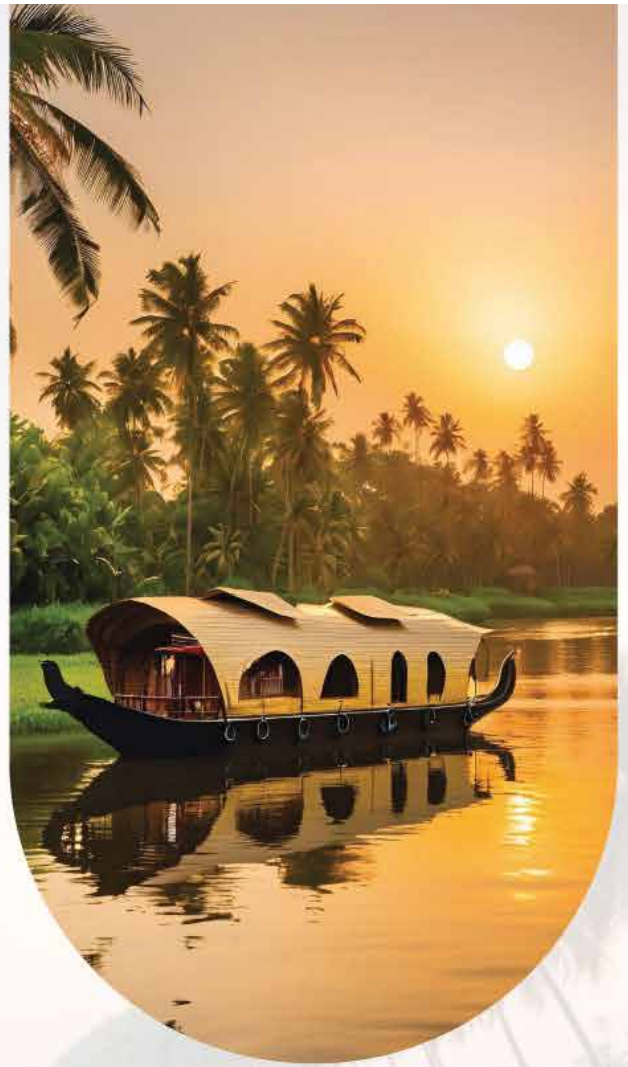
**Day 04: Thekkady (Periyar) – Alleppey**  
(by surface) 140 kms / 3hrs.

Morning after breakfast, Drive to Alleppey to Board a houseboat.

**Day 06: Kumarakom – Cochin**  
50 kms / 2 hrs; Cochin – Delhi (by flight)

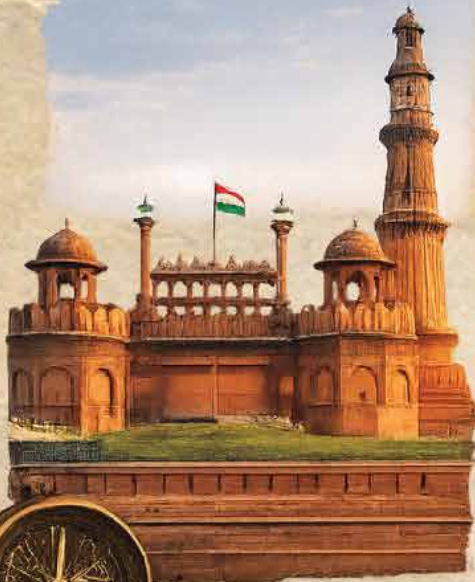

## Day 1: Delhi - Varanasi

You are transferred to Delhi airport after breakfast and catch a flight to Varanasi. Upon reaching Varanasi you check in to your hotel room. In the evening, you leave to explore Varanasi and attend the majestic arti on the banks of Ganges. You further get back to the room and stay overnight.

## Day 2: Varanasi - Sarnath

The day is started off on the banks of Ganga, savoring a magnificent view of the sunrise. You get back to the hotel for breakfast and lead towards Sarnath. Sarnath is where legendary emperor Ashoka spent good times of his life and built Dharmarajika Stupa and erected his symbolic pillars. By late evening, you get back to your room and stay overnight.

## Day 3: Varanasi - Delhi

Refreshing breakfast is followed by transfer to Delhi Airport to continue your own journey. Hence this soulful journey ends.

# ITINERARY

## *Rajasthan*

India is a land of vibrant colours, rich culture, royal heritage, and timeless beauty. With a civilization over 5,000 years old, it reflects a unique blend of religions, languages, traditions, art, and cuisine. Every region of India offers its own charm—from majestic forts and palaces to serene beaches, temples, jungles, and colourful festivals.

### **RAJASTHAN**

Rajasthan, the land of the Maharajas, represents India at its exotic and magical best. Filled with vibrant colours, legends, mighty forts, elaborate palaces, and grand cities, it truly feels like a living royal fairy tale.



## Day 01: Arrival Delhi

Meet upon arrival and transfer to the hotel. Overnight at hotel.

## Day 02: Delhi-Agra

(Breakfast)

Breakfast. Half day tour of old and New Delhi. New Delhi: India's capital and an important gateway into the country. Visit **Lutyen's Delhi-drive** past President's palace and also known as **Rashtrapati Bhawan, India gate, a World War I memorial**. Lutyen's city is characterized by wide, tree-lined avenues, parks and palaces built for important Indian Princes. Visit **Humayuns Tomb**, built in the mid-16th century by Haji Begum, the Persian born senior wife of Humayaun, the second Mughal emperor, this is wonderful early example of Mughal architecture.

Drive to Agra. Arrive Agra and check-in to hotel for overnight.

## Day 03: Agra-Fatehpur Sikri-Jaipur

(Breakfast)

Breakfast. Visit **Taj Mahal**: - Described as the most extravagant monument ever built for love. It was constructed by Emperor Shah Jahan in memory of his second wife Mumtaz Mahal- described by the Indian classical poet Tagore as a "tear on the face of eternity".

**Visit Agra Fort**: - Constructed of the massive red sandstone Agra Fort on the bank of River Yamuna, was begun by Emperor Akbar in 1565. The auricular fort's colossal double walls rise over 20 m in height and measure 2.5 km in circumference. Drive to Jaipur visiting Fatehpur Sikri en-route. The juxtaposition of the buildings seems whimsical, they are thoughtfully planned, imparting an atmosphere of playful brilliance. It is a perfect example of a Mughal city at the height of the Empire's splendor.

Arrive and check-in to hotel for overnight.

## Day 04: Jaipur

(Breakfast)

Breakfast. Visit **Amber fort** built in the 17th Century; the palace is a distinguished specimen of Rajput architecture. Take a joy ride on an elephant back at Amber Fort. Thereafter, Explore the city starting from the **Pink City Palace** which now houses a museum containing rare manuscript, painting and an armory; visit the Palace of Winds-a Landmark of Jaipur made of pink sandstone and of unique design. Also visit **Jantar Mantar**-Observatory (Astronomical instrument).

## Day 05: Jaipur-Jodhpur

(Breakfast)

**Drive to Jodhpur** (approx. 6hrs). Arrive Jodhpur and check in at hotel. Visit **Mehrangarh Fort** one of the most impressive forts in Rajasthan, visit the museum inside which has a good collection of weapons, canopies, royal hodha and royal cradles. Also, visit nearby **Royal Memorial**. Overnight at hotel.

## Day 06: Jodhpur-Ranakpur-Udaipur

(Breakfast)

Drive to Udaipur (approx 06 Hrs.) visiting en-route **Ranakpur**- Visit **Jain Temple** of Ranakpur where its 1444 intricately carved pillars is unlike one another. Arrive Udaipur and check in to hotel. Evening is free at leisure. Overnight at hotel.

## Day 07: Udaipur

(Breakfast)

Morning visit **City Palace** - series of palaces clustered into an impressive whole, **Sahelion-ki-bari** and **Folk Art Museum**.

Evening at leisure or free for optional activities. Overnight at hotel.

## Day 08: Udaipur-Delhi or Mumbai &-further destination

Morning on time transfer to domestic airport for flight to **Mumbai or Delhi**.
